One way to keep up with your child's progress is through our online gradebook. Power School is available to you through the Camden County website, www.camden.k12.ga.us. We encourage you to check this site regularly. Also, feel free to contact us through e-mail. In the past, we have found that this is an easy way for us to respond to your questions and concerns in a timely manner. You may also call the school to request a phone conference with a specific teacher or schedule a time to come in for a team conference. Additionally, there is a class website. This website will have all weekly vocabulary words that are used, as well as our weekly projects. If you have ever completed a job like fixing a leaky faucet, building a bookcase, or repairing a car, then you know that in order to get the job done properly, you must have the correct tools. The school will provide a daily assignment planner, or agenda book. If the planner the school issues your child is lost or damaged beyond repair, it is the child's responsibility to purchase another one. They are available in the front office. Assignments and other pertinent information should be written in the planner each day (whether they have homework or not). This book also serves as the student's hall pass and should be kept with each student from class to class and taken home each night. This planner serves as the easiest mode of communication between school and home. It is essential for all students to have their planner in addition to other basic supplies that are required to complete their daily work in each class. Please, take a moment to discuss these rules with your child. It is crucial for everyone to be responsible for his or her own behavior.
